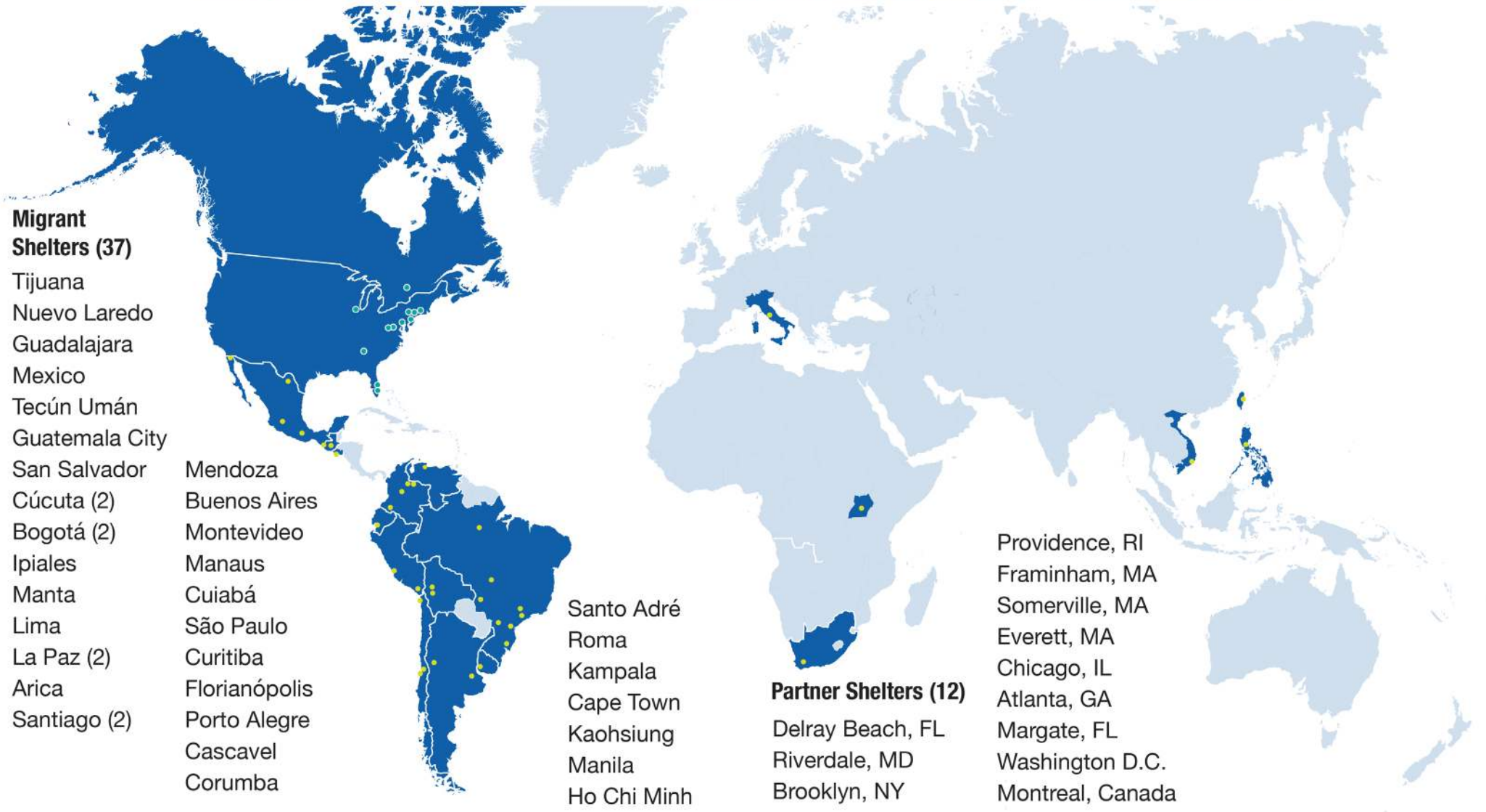

Migrants enrolled in educational courses and vocational training programs, enhancing their employability and integration into host communities.



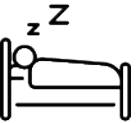
856,277

People were provided with medical care. Through clinics, mobile units, and partnerships with healthcare providers, the network addressed urgent medical needs and promoted overall well-being.

Individuals received psychological support. This support helped them cope with trauma, stress, and mental health challenges. Through counseling services and specialized programs, the network prioritized the well-being and resilience of migrants and refugees.



3,965

Migrants were supported with the labor insertion, helping them secure stable employment opportunities. Through vocational training, job placement programs, and partnerships with businesses, the network facilitated their integration into the workforce.
