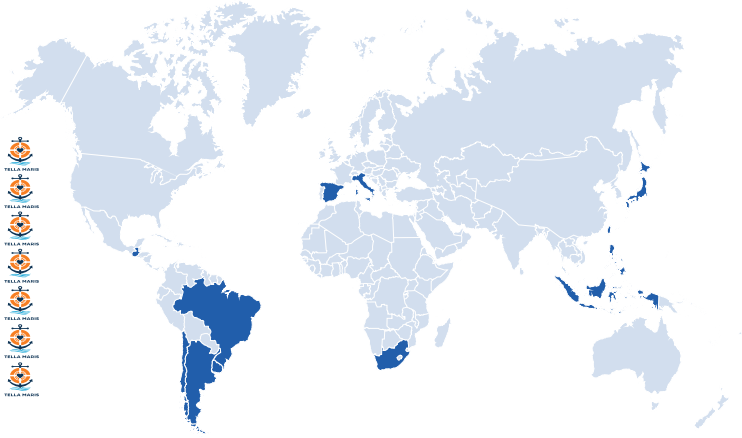

More than **2,920** ships were visited by our chaplains and volunteers, ensuring pastoral care and assistance to crews.

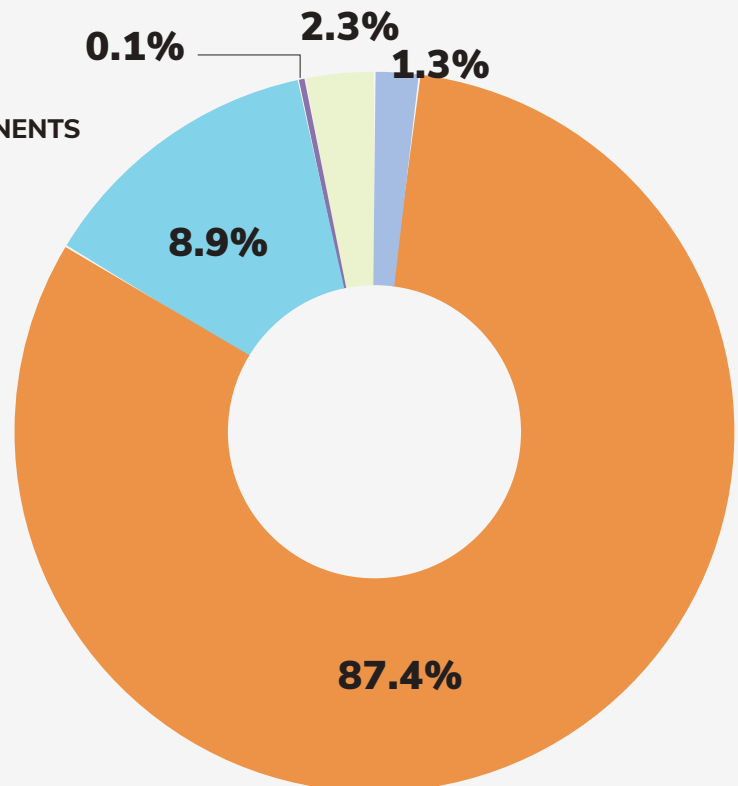
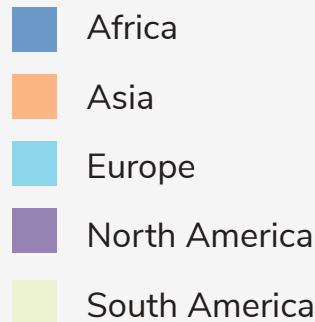

Religious Services



The Network celebrated Masses aboard ships, distributed prayer materials and devotional items. It offered counseling, spiritual guidance and blessings to the crews and ships.

Mental Health Support



Offered mental health consultations and workshops to seafarers and fishers, and delivered crisis intervention and peer support sessions to seafarers facing isolation or distress.

Organized events, fostering connection and solidarity. Delivered care packages to seafarers and fishers.

Paralegal Assistance



Provided legal guidance and advocacy for seafarers and fishers' cases related to labor disputes, contracts, and human rights. Supported seafarers and fishers with immigration or repatriation.

Provided Wi-Fi access and phone services to seafarers, enabling them to connect with their loved ones. Facilitated virtual family reunions.

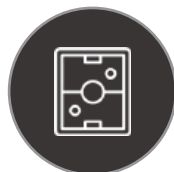
Health Services
